Hands-on Learning Centers



- Bi-weekly Chinese centers

Fun and hands-on activities. Each session will be 1 hour and 15 minutes. Students rotate among five different learning centers each for 15 minutes. 4 parents will be needed to run each center.

Technology/Computer

- Quizlet for reviewing Meizhou Chinese characters



Newsletter

- Newsletters will be sent home monthly on the first Thursday of the month with blue folder.
- Current copy of it will also be uploaded to my website.

New Report Card



 New report card this year to be aligned with State Common Core Standards

- 4-points instead of the 6-point system
- More information will be given by the school district



Birthdays:

- Each child will receive a birthday bag with a book and a sheet of stickers from me.

Thursday Folders

- Completed class work will be sent home in Thursday folder.
- Occasionally, incomplete work or work that needs parents' signature, will also be included in either Thursday folder or homework folder.
- Please help your child finish his/her work; sign and return the folder.

Labels



- Sweaters, jackets, sweatshirts as well as lunch bags and water bottles need to be labeled with your child's name.
- These items are commonly misplaced and can be easily returned if they are labeled.



Punctuality

- Students should be inside the classroom ready to begin the day at 8:30.
